### Literacy

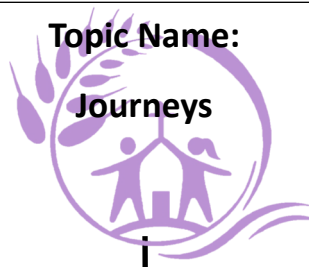
Using information books. E.g. maps and non fiction books

### Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Is proactive in seeking adult support and is able to articulate their wants and needs.  
Carry out plans to reach a goal.  
Show high levels of independence, resilience and perseverance.  
Is aware of behavioural expectations and is sensitive to ideas of justice and fairness.  
Is more able to manage their feelings and tolerate situations in which their wishes cannot be met.

### Communication & Language

Uses language to imagine and recreate roles and experiences in play situations.  
Links statements and sticks to a main theme or intention.  
Uses talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events.  
Extends vocabulary, exploring the meaning and sounds of new words.

### Understanding the World

Begins to compare different ways to travel now and in the past.  
Recognise and talk about the past using books and pictures.  
Looks closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change in nature.  
Makes observations of animals, plants, machinery and explains why some things occur, and talks about changes.

### Expressive Art & Design

Develop a narrative in role play.  
Uses their increased knowledge and understanding of tools and materials to explore their interests and develop their thinking.  
Develops their own ideas through experimentation with materials.  
Begins to build a collection of songs and dances.  
Takes music in a range of ways.

### Physical Development

Forms most letters correctly. Can do up buttons.  
Good control and co-ordination in large and small movement.  
Practices some appropriate safety measures without direct supervision, considering both benefits and risks of a physical experience.  
Is usually dry and clean during the day.
